

Thank You to All Chapter Treasurers who submitted dues on time! If you have not yet send them in, please check with State Treasurer Diana Galvan for information regarding late fees.

The State Executive Board has set the **California State Scholarship Award** at **\$2500**. The award shall be given to a member of California Alpha Delta Kappa in good standing for professional growth. "Professional growth" is defined to be enrolled in an academic degree program in an accredited college or university. This may include pursuit of National Teacher Certification. Applications are due March 1st; links to more information and the application are included at the end of this newsletter.

International Bylaws, Article XVII, Section 1 and Section 2 Changes Adopted at International

<u>Convention</u> in Washington, D.C. this past summer will require voting at State Convention. There are two options for States to consider:

Option 1—Retain State Bylaws (if the State prefers their bylaws as a governing document for the State) Option 2—Suspend State Bylaws (This requires a comprehensive State Policies and Procedures Manual in place, which supports the International Bylaws and has statements which comply with IRS requirements.) The State Board must make a recommendation, which we will do at our March meeting. An informal poll indicates the desire to retain our State Bylaws. This would mean delegates must vote on Proposed Amendments to State Bylaws to keep them in compliance with International Bylaws. Information will be sent out to chapters mid-March so they may review and give direction to their delegate(s) for Convention. Regardless of the State's actions, this change in International gives Chapters the same choice — suspend their Chapter Bylaws if they have a comprehensive Policies and Procedures document in place (or create one), or retain Chapter Bylaws. More information will be coming!

Reminder: Please notify State Chaplain Becky Sikes (contact info on first page)of any sisters who have joined Omega this biennium so that we may honor them at Convention.
