## TREASURER'S CORNER

## From California State Treasurer Diana Galvan

## Dues are DUE © January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013

Chapter Treasurers should have received their annual H-138 Members Payment Record.

- 1. Make a copy of the H-138 as it is no longer a 3-part form.
- 2. On the copy add a column for CA State dues which remain at \$20 per member, unless exempt for Limited Status or Life Membership.
- 3. Collect the dues and indicate payment on this copy.
- 4. When complete, make another copy for your chapter records and send one to CA State Treasurer, **Diana Galvan**, **2402 Ridgeside Ct.**, **Roseville**, **CA 95661**, with your chapter's state dues check made out to ADK California.
- 5. Track international dues on the original H-133. Make a copy for your records before mailing it to International with your chapter's international dues check made out to Alpha Delta Kappa.
- 6. Please collect and mail your dues in December or early January to avoid late fees. Do not wait for one or two late members.
- 7. Any dues received at International or at the State after January 31<sup>st</sup> will incur a \$5.00 late fee for both International and State.

## AND...FISCAL YEAR CHANGE

In a letter from International Headquarters sent to all chapter presidents this summer, chapters were advised that **ALL** chapters of Alpha Delta Kappa will follow the fiscal year, **June 1 to May 31**. International will do a mass change with the Internal Revenue Service to accomplish the fiscal year change. **Chapters must sign a letter requesting this change and return it to International in the envelope provided.** 

After reviewing the **C-1 Annual Chapter Reporting Form and Audit forms** submitted this past summer, it is apparent that many of California's chapters are <u>not</u> following this fiscal year. To be sure to be included in the mass change with the IRS, chapter presidents are urged to sign and return the letter from headquarters immediately. Also, please be sure that your Chapter Treasurer is aware that the fiscal year is **June 1 to May 31** beginning with 2012, which is the year to be reported on the 2013 C-1 Reporting Form next June.

# And this from International... News from the IRS

The Internal Revenue Service is no longer mailing notices about chapters' or states' tax exempt status being automatically revoked for failure to file the 990, 990EZ or 990N e-Postcard for three consecutive years. If the entity files the 990N e-Postcard and it is rejected, the chapter/state can call the IRS at (877) 829-5500 to learn whether its tax exempt status has been revoked. There is also a new tool on the IRS website, "Exempt Organizations Select Check," that will let you find out whether your tax exempt status has been automatically revoked, or if your chapter has filed the 990N e-Postcard. Please go to www.irs.gov and search for "Exempt Organizations Select Check" to search by EIN.

If your chapter's or state's tax exempt status has been revoked, please contact International Headquarters, (800) 247-2311.

After December 31, 2012, chapters and states that have lost tax exempt status will still be able to apply for reinstatement of their status, but the fee will be either \$400 or \$850, depending on revenue. The special \$100 transitional relief fee will no longer be a possibility.

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## The History of Alpha Delta Kappa's International Teacher Exchange Program

In 1961 Alpha Delta Kappa, International Honorary Organization for Women Educators, unanimously adopted the concept for the International Teacher Education program as its International altruistic program — a program designed, at that time, to bring women students to the United States for their final year in teacher training. In 1963, the first three Alpha Delta Kappa-International Teacher Education students arrived from Switzerland, Germany, and Argentina. Each student received a \$1,000 scholarship. Through the years, Alpha Delta Kappa has increased the size of its scholarships, and today each recipient receives a \$10,000 scholarship. To date, Alpha Delta Kappa has sponsored over 200 students from more than 40 countries.

The goals of the International Teacher Education Program provide students from countries outside the United States the following opportunities:

- To study in American universities and colleges;
- To learn about the philosophy of education, methods, and materials of instruction in the United States;
- To observe democracy in action;
- To share their experiences with people both in the United States and abroad.
