October is AAK month and it is appropriate to acknowledge the women of vision who are responsible for California Alpha Delta Kappa. I know you will do likewise during your Founders' Day celebrations.



On the afternoon of August 25, 1953, Agnes Shipman and Marie Neal, Founders of Alpha Delta Kappa, Pauline Martin, Missouri State Chairman, and Maye Payne, Arkansas State Chairman, chartered California's first chapter, Alpha, in Oakland, and, in the evening of the same day, California Beta was chartered in San Francisco. The national leaders then went south to Fresno, chartering California Gamma. The team continuing south, initiating California Delta and California Epsilon in Los Angeles. The last chapters to be chartered during this initial organizational period were Zeta in Long Beach, Eta in San Diego, and Theta in Bakersfield. On October 13-14, 1956, the first California State Convention was held at the Claremont Hotel in Berkeley. One hundred and thirty-two members were registered. Dorothy Vaio, Beta, was elected to the California State Board at that Convention.

I am eternally grateful to the exceptional women who have come before me; I have had the honor and privilege of knowing Grand President, Betty Rosenberg, and Past State Presidents Joan Taber, Mayme Chinn, Dorothy Vaio, Barbara Hill, Belle Goldstein, Noel Leonard, Anna Konstantopoulos, Alice Bullard, Barbara Hill, Susan Goto, Barbara Murray, Donna Ray, Linda Futterer, Judy Welch, Rosemary Heenan, and my own Xi sister and mentor, Barbara Stein. I name these women, because along with many other California and International sisters, these women have each **made a difference** in my life ~ not only in my life, but in the lives of countless women educators and the many lives touched by them. I am honored to be a member of California Alpha Delta Kappa and to serve as your state president. I will do my best to continue making a difference; I wish you all the best this school year and Fall season and I challenge you to join me in **Making a Difference** during the 2012-2014 biennium.
