

One exciting new beginning for California Alpha Delta Kappa will be the chartering of our newest chapter on March 16th in the Fullerton/La Habra area! Many thanks to California Past-President Judy Welch and the Gamma Nu sisters who have supported this effort over the past two years. I challenge every chapter to offer the honor of membership in our worthy organization to outstanding women educators in your area. Here are details about the current International Membership Campaign:

The Membership Campaign 2013 challenge is to initiate five or more new members or reinstate former members. (Current members transferring into your chapter do not count.) These five or more new/reinstated members must be initiated/reinstated and **all forms (R-12) and fees must be received at Headquarters by April 15, 2013**. [Required forms for new members are H-103 (Membership Application and Badge order) and H-133 (Report of Initiation). The required form for reinstatement is H-154.] Each chapter that initiates/reinstates a minimum of five members between January 1, 2013 and April 15, 2013 will be recognized in a special section of the December KAPPAN. In addition, chapters will be entered into a S/P/N (state, provincial, national) drawing for a \$100 donation made payable to a charity of your choice or the Alpha Delta Kappa Foundation. Chapters will receive one entry for each member initiated/reinstated.

We then filled them with toiletries; shampoo, conditioner, tooth brush, tooth paste, comb, deodorant, soap, body wash, nail files, the necessary items that women need. They will be distributed to women when they enter the shelter. Many women flee a relationship with only the clothes on their backs. We also presented them with a check for \$1100.00, which we raised at our annual Christmas silent auction.

How grateful the women at Project Safehouse will be to receive these items. Thank you, Eta sisters!

Gamma Nu sister Harriet Kelly sent this along about the difference one individual can make... Gamma Nu sister Myrna Capsuto participated in a Dance-a-thon to raise money for the City of Hope; Member Wende Borowski is a Santa Margarita High School counselor who works with seniors to mentor freshman in the Link Program. California State Altruistic Project 2012-14: Summer Search

Summer Search is a leadership development program for young people who strive to break the cycle of poverty, transitioning young people into productive adults and positive role models in their communities. The mission is to identify resilient, low income high school students and inspire them through year-round mentoring, life-changing summer experiences, college advising, and a lasting support system. Beginning as a sophomore in high school, the students are monitored weekly by professionals who challenge the students to greater awareness and prepare them for their summer programs. As juniors, they attend the wilderness leadership expedition. As seniors they attend a domestic academic program or participate in community service and international home stay. When the students enter college they receive financial aid counseling and help in navigating through the entire entrance process http://summersearch.org/

Dropbox is a virtual storage place on the internet and accessible from all devices. To sign-up you have to have an email account and create a password. My chapter did a generic email and password that all members could have access to. The program provides free storage space up to 2 GB. You can pay for more storage if you find that you need it.
