California Vice President for Membership Mari Page





World Understanding Report

World Understanding Chairman Kathleen O'Malley reported that the window for donations to the International World Understanding Project Teach Too has closed because the project has reached the goal of \$50,000.

TEACH TOO requested grant funds to construct transitional housing for 48 older teens to enable them to finish their education and learn an occupation. According to Haitian law, children residing in licensed orphanages cannot remain after the age of 18. As a result, older students have had to leave the Imagine Missions orphanage without the skills or abilities required to be independent and successful. Transitional housing with occupancy limited to two years

or less enables these students to finish their most important goal—completing their education. Imagine Missions will mentor these students and assist them through this process.

A new World Understanding Project will be vetted and voted on in the future.

Below are the altruistic projects and funds that chapters may want to consider donating to:

- 1. New Day for Children: This is the California State Altruistic Project. It is a restorative program for girls rescued from sex trafficking. Donations may be sent to State Treasurer Marlene Cordova with New Day for Children in the memo line. Check is made out to California Alpha Delta Kappa.
- 2. <u>California State Scholarship Fund:</u> This fund finances the District Mini Scholarships given twice each biennium, and the Eleanor Bendell State Scholarship awarded at the State Convention. Donations may be sent to State Treasurer Marlene Cordova with California State Scholarship in the memo line. Check is made out to California Alpha Delta Kappa.
- 3. <u>Educators Helping Educators</u>: This fund awards \$300 per person for educators who have suffered loss due to a disaster such as the California wildfires. Donations may be sent to State Treasurer Marlene Cordova with Educators Helping Educators in the memo line. Check is made out to California Alpha Delta Kappa.
- 4. <u>The Longest Day</u>: California's Alpha Delta Kappa team for The Longest Day Alzheimer's fundraising activity is called California Cares. Fundraising will start again in 2020.

- 6. <u>International Altruistic Projects St. Jude Children's Research</u> Hospital and Alzheimer's Association

Eleanor Bendell State Scholarship

This \$2,500 is given to a member of California Alpha Delta Kappa who is actively engaged in the field of education and is seeking professional growth.

Professional growth is defined as enrollment in an advanced study program or engaged in creating or participating in a project that advances student/educator proficiency. Examples may include enrollment in an academic degree or certificate program in an accredited college or university, or creating curriculum that enriches and enables students to learn and teachers to teach.

The scholarship is open to any Alpha Delta Kappa member who has been in good standing for the previous biennium.

The guidelines, application form, and the evaluation rubric are on the California website in Awards/Grants/Scholarships.
