## President Karen Kirby's Goals for 2018 – 2020:

- 1. To see each chapter initiate one new member each year of the biennium. This was a goal last biennium. I am continuing with this important goal.
- 2. To inspire at least 30% of California's chapters to receive Alpha Delta Kappa's 7-Pearl Award, 23 chapters represented California at the NW/SW regional conference. This is a pearl requirement. These 23 chapters are eligible for 7 pearls.
- 3. To inspire at least 30% of California's chapters not eligible to receive a 7-Pearl Award (see #2) to receive 6 Pearls. Those chapters will receive special recognition for striving toward excellence.
- 4. To increase attendance at all California district conferences and the 2020 State Convention by 20%. This is a chance for me to meet my California sisters face to face and listen to you. I hope to see many more of you at your district conference and at the 2020 State Convention.
- 5. To provide each chapter, council, and state officer training so each officer understands the duties and responsibilities of their office. The California State Executive Board will prepare updated officer training materials. I will be relying on state officers to disseminate these materials in a timely manner.
- 6. To support altruistic endeavors at all levels of Alpha Delta Kappa. This includes St. Jude's Children's Hospital and Alzheimer's Association at the International level; New Day for Children at our state level; all and any projects at the council and chapter levels

7. To continue to use technology as an effective and efficient method of communication while also focusing on personal contact. The California AAK website and the President's Newsletters have proven to be effective communication tools. However, sometimes, human interaction is the best method of communication, something I feel we all need to return to.

Congratulations. New Day for Children is the new State Altruistic project nominated by Beta Upsilon. New Day for Children operates restorative programs for girls from the ages of 10 to 18 who have been victims of sex trafficking. Their facilities are located in Northern CA and support a statewide population with partner locations in the Western US. The project provides the girls with schooling as they work toward their high school diplomas, and as they transition to college or careers. The project also provides safe housing, therapy and emotional

# Educators Helping Educators Crisis Relief Funds Available

Recent disasters have caused havoc in many areas of our state. The California Executive Board has established a process and an application to disseminate funds to help our members and fellow educators who suffer losses from disasters.

A request for funds may be submitted by a member. Members or chapters aware of someone in need of assistance may request funds. Help may be requested on behalf of a member, an individual nonmember or for educators at a school site

Two funding sources are available. The California Educators Helping Educators funds may be given to members or to non-members. International Alpha Delta Kappa Foundation funds donated to California for disaster relief may be given to members only.

To request funds, go to the state website, adkcalif.org, and click on the Educators Helping Educators Application found in Forms on the right side of the home page.

#### **California District Mini-Grants**

The purpose of **CA District Mini- Grants** is "to promote continuing professional and/or personal development while benefiting other members of the community at large." This grant is available to both classroom and retired educators. A total of \$500 in grant money is available to each district in the state. Applications are short, easy to complete and are available on the CA state web site. Application deadline is **October 30**.

#### **Regional Mini-Grants**

Regional Mini-Grants pay \$500 and are for members who apply to attend non A∆K-sponsored conferences, conventions, seminars, workshops and non-credit classes. The full description is on the International website under Scholarships and grants. The due date is Oct. 15.

#### **Innovation and Classroom Grants**

November 1 is the deadline for submitting applications for the Innovative and the Classrooms grants. The purpose of both grants is to help teachers be creative in their lesson planning. These grants pay for materials and services that enhance classroom lessons.

The Innovative grant pays \$200 and is for non- Alpha Delta Kappa members. A member must recommend the teacher applying and the teacher needs to fill out an application.

The **Classroom** grant pays **\$400**. This grant is for members and requires only an application. Applications and the grant

requirements are on the International web site under Grants.

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#### **Pearls of Achievement**

How did your chapter do this past year in gathering those pearls? Pearls signify more than just garnering them to achieve a 7-Pearl status. Pearls indicate how many of the 5 required forms your chapter has submitted, along with initiating or reinstating a member and if your chapter sent a delegate to a regional conference or an international convention.

I remember, as a classroom teacher, how frustrated I was when assignments were not turned in on time. I spent an inordinate amount of time retrieving those assignments. I feel the same way about the forms that are required for Pearls. Each form is something International requires us to complete so they can do their jobs as stewards of our organization. I, personally, have spent an inordinate amount of time chasing down missing chapter forms. State board officers have had the same experience.

I ask you all to be sensitive to deadlines, and to turn in required forms by the deadline. Not just to gather pearls, but to do the business of our organization in a timely manner.

#### Now, on to some accolades.

There were 18 California chapters that achieved 7-Pearl status. That is an amazing number. I thank Past President Diana Galvan for making this achievement a priority. These outstanding chapters are:

These chapters missed 7-Pearl status for two reasons. Either they did not initiate or reinstate a new member (6 chapters), or they did not send a chapter representative to the NW/SW Regional conference (8 chapters). In 2019, the requirement in this category will be to attend the International Convention.

All 14 chapters completed the required forms on time.

I hope the requirements of attendance to a regional conference or to an international convention will be reconsidered. There should be sensitivity to the time restrictions for our actively teaching sisters and the cost of

travel to these venues. Chapters should not be penalized for not attending these events.

I personally asked International President Sue Pelchat to ask her board to reconsider this requirement. I suggested the attendance to a state convention as an addition to this pearl requirement.

Keep on top of those form deadlines, and let's see if we can improve California's pearls score.

#### **Friendly Reminder to Treasurers**

Hello Ladies. Welcome to the 2018-2020 biennium. Now that your chapters are planning their altruistic and scholarship fund-raising activities, please be aware of your responsibility when holding a raffle. The State of California, Department of Justice, requires that you file an "Application for Registration" Form, include your "Entity Status Letter" and send \$20 made payable to the Department of Justice.

The registration period is from September 1 through August 31. Upon approval, the Registry of Charitable Trusts will send a confirmation letter confirming your registration that includes a raffle permit number and expiration date. You may register more than

one raffle on the application. After your raffle or raffles you must submit a "Nonprofit Raffle Report" for all of them no later than October 1. If you sent in an application last biennium, you need to file the "Nonprofit Raffle Report" by this coming October 1. All directions and forms are located on the California ADK Website under "Treasurer's Corner". If you need assistance, please contact me.
