

State Board Actions

At the November Executive Board meeting, the State Board voted to change the rotation of the State Conventions to alternate between the more northern and more southern halves of the state. The new rotation beginning in 2016 will be Valley, Marina, Northern, Southern. We looked into establishing a Facebook page for California $A\Delta K$; however, the International Facebook page is already in place and would serve the same purpose as well as give sisters connections across the country.

Resolutions!

Occasionally, the California State Board does something out of the ordinary and definitely worthy of your notice! We have submitted two resolutions to International. After the Northwest/Southwest Regional Conference this past summer, there was much discussion about the need for International's decision making processes to be more inclusive. The first resolution asks International to accommodate the needs of members by obtaining more input from state and local

leaders in determining the date and location of regional conferences. The second resolution asks International to actively seeking input of state/national/provincial leaders regarding items on the International Board's agenda.

Also, Alpha Psi has submitted a resolution requesting consideration of a different way to attach our pins to clothing that uses a separate piece of material.

If these resolutions get through the International Resolutions Committee, they will be presented at the International Convention in Salt Lake City in July, 2015. Make your travel plans now so your chapter's voice can be heard in consideration of these resolutions!

Bylaws

So chapters can maintain their "non-profit" status, the IRS requires that they must have a governing document - such as bylaws. The State Executive Board recommends that all chapters in the state retain their bylaws. This fall, chapters must vote to either retain their bylaws and submit a "Letter of Certification", or vote to suspend their bylaws and prepare an official statement for their Policies and Procedures Manual for the State Bylaws Chairman. Bylaws chairman sent letters to all chapters asking for the results of their chapter's vote. Most chapters will vote to retain their bylaws and check the first box. Then just send the letter back to Susan!

International Chapter accepted a proposal to allocate funds for the Alpha Delta Kappa Classroom Grant. NEW SCHOLARSHIPS!

Maxine B. Pettibone Scholarship

The Maxine B. Pettibone Scholarship is awarded to the direct descendants of active members of Alpha Delta Kappa. This scholarship was created for students working on their Master's degree in education who have the#

aspiration of continuing as outstanding educators in the field of education. The scholarship recipient shall have already displayed success through completion and attainment of certification with undergraduate coursework for teaching in his/her chosen major area of study. Recipients may be invited to present during International convention or regional conference(s). The fall semester scholarship application must be postmarked or received electronically on or before March 1 and the spring semester scholarship must be postmarked or received electronically on or before September 1.

Future Educator Scholarship

The Alpha Delta Kappa Future Educator Scholarship is awarded to assist education majors in their final two semesters of coursework with tuition, room and board and course materials. This scholarship was developed for students who display potential to be excellent educators. The Future Educator Scholarship will be awarded annually to one recipient from each of the seven Alpha Delta Kappa regions. The scholarship application packet must be postmarked or received electronically on or before March 1.

The proceeds of the concert are given directly to children in Africa who are at risk of starvation. They have given the funds for food through the well known and respected charitable organization, World Vision. One of the most enjoyable fundraising events that Christel has produced and directed is the "Evening of Entertainment" that showcases the talents of high school students in all aspects of musical entertainment. Also, in the name of Alpha Delta Kappa, Christel has given monthly financial support to the Calvin Crest Outdoor

Education Program and the Fresno Institute of Urban Leadership.

Xi Chapter initiated Christel in 2010. In addition to her very busy teaching career, she has served as chapter co-president and chaplain. She is an active member of the National Association of Music Education, the American Choral Directors Association and the Fresno and Madera Counties Music Educators Association. I am SO proud that Christel is my Xi sister!




