# **CONFERENCE SELLING OK**

Chapters may now sell items to support their altruistic projects at district conferences according to a change made in the State Policy and Procedures by the CA Executive Board in response to a resolution passed at the CA State Convention.

Chapters may sell only at their own district conference. The policy change does not pertain to conventions or to regional conferences.

To sell, a chapter must request permission in writing from the host council and pay a \$20 non-refundable venders fee. Funds from the items sold are to be used for altruistic projects. The host council has the final decision in the number of chapters that may sell and in the placement of the sales tables based on the space available.  $\infty$ 

# **CRISIS FUND PLANNED**

The Executive Board is working on the Policy and Procedures for the second resolution passed at the State Convention, according to Diana Galvan, State President. This resolution asks the State Executive Board to explore establishing a permanent fund to support educators who have suffered losses through natural disasters or crises, to be funded by volunteer contributions of Alpha Delta Kappa Sisters.  $\infty$

# FUNDS FOR PROJECTS

Need some help in getting a special project started? This fall, there are grants available that can get you on your way.

The purpose of **CA District Mini-grants** is "to promote continuing professional and/or personal development while benefiting other members of the community at large." This grant is available to both classroom and retired educators. A total of \$500 in grant money is available to each district in the state. Applications are available on the CA state web site. <u>Application deadline is October 30</u>.

November 1 is the deadline for submitting applications for the Innovative and the Classrooms grants. The purpose of both grants is to help teachers be creative in their lesson planning.

The **Innovative** grant is for non- Alpha Delta Kappa members. A member must recommend the teacher applying and the teacher needs to fill out an application.

The **Classroom** grant is for members and requires only an application.

Applications and the grant requirements are on the International web site under Grants.

"Last year 17 Innovation Grants were awarded to educators who had dreams that would not have come to fruition without them," said **Mollie Acosta**, Innovation Grant Chair.∞
