Three thousand dollars awaits the next Eleanor Bendell State Scholarship winner. The award is given to a member of CA Alpha Delta Kappa who is actively engaged in education and is seeking advanced study or development of a project advancing student or educator proficiency. Applications available on the state website must be emailed to State Scholarship chairman, Robin Burns no later than March 1. The recipient will be announced at the state convention in May.

REGISTER BY APRIL 1 TO ATTEND CALIFORNIA STATE CONVENTION

Head down Santa Ana way May 4 to May 6 and celebrate the California AΔK Vision at Fiesta de Mayo during the thirty-second state convention. Your destination is the Santa Ana DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel. The three days of smiles, sisterhood and yes, salsa begin on May 4 with the Hola Reception. Saturday is jampacked with activities from the Leadership Breakfast to a general session to conduct state business including election of new state officers and ending in the traditional elegant Banquet and Installation of Officers. Sisters who have joined Omega in this biennium will be remembered at the Memorial Service led by Kathleen O'Malley, state chaplain, on Sunday morning. Susan Raffo is convention chair.

Karen Kirby of Gamma Mu will move from the office of president-elect to lead the state for the next two years. Karen has served as Excellence in Education chair, state recording secretary and state treasurer. Registration forms are available on the state web site, were mailed to chapter presidents, and attached to this newsletter. Registration deadline is **April 1**.

LEONARD FUNDS AVAILABLE TO CONVENTION ATTENDEES

The generosity of **Noel Leonard**, state president from 1992-1994, provides \$100 in financial aid for first- timers at the state convention in Santa Ana and a similar amount for council leaders attending the regional conference in Anchorage, Alaska this summer.

Each council receives one first-timer grant. Chapters nominate one member who has not attended a state convention and who shows promise of leadership in the organization. Her name is then submitted to the council where a random drawing is held to determine the recipient. The council presidents must notify the state president of their selections by **April 1, 2018**.

Regional conference grants are for officers or a designee of a council to further their leadership skills. There is one grant for each council with recipients chosen by the council. The deadline for submitting the names to the state president for this award is **June 1, 2018.**

SALES AT STATE CONVENTION

Chapter altruistic sales may take place at the state convention. To reserve a place, chapters must submit the application available on the Home Page of the state website to Marlene Cordova, state treasurer, listing the items for sale and the name of the altruistic project that will benefit. The application must include a \$20 donation to the State Altruistic Project. Applications must be received no later than **April 1, 2018**. Space is limited.

IS YOUR INFORMATION UP TO DATE?



Chapter Presidents, Treasurers and Membership Chairmen

now have access to <u>updating their chapter roster</u> online on the International website: <u>www.alphadeltakappa.org.</u>, according to Sue Pelchat, International President. An added enhancement now gives the state executive board access to the directory.

It is no longer necessary to use the H-119 Member Changes form to notify multiple state officers of directory changes.

It is important that the **information on file at** International is kept <u>up to date</u>. A suggestion is to include a demonstration of the Directory as an agenda item at your next meeting and to review the information at least once a year. Include a review of each member's directory listing. Directions for exporting your chapter directory are at the top of the window. Each member has access to updating her own directory information.

The benefits of updating your chapter roster online, instead of using the H-119, Report for Member Changes form (except for transfers), are:

- -Reduced paperwork/forms in response to members' requests.
- -To unburden the members/chapters with duplicating the notification of changes.
- -The directory contains the most current information for your S/P/N that is on file at Headquarters.
- -The roster can be used as is because it is current instead of needing to recreate your own.
- -No longer needing to download and complete the form for each member then mailing/emailing/faxing it to multiple recipients.

BUDGET CONCERNS SURVEY RESULTS

In an effort to receive input from our California members, the CA executive board sent a survey via email to 975 members with email addresses on file and also to each chapter president with the request that the survey opportunity be shared with all chapter members. The survey included three questions regarding possible solutions to balance the proposed budget for 2018-2020.

- 1. Raise dues by \$5.00 per member 71% yes, 29% no
- 2. Combine the positions of corresponding and recording secretaries 94% yes; 6% no
- 3. Do both options 77% yes, 23% no

There were also many valuable comments received, each of which was reviewed by all board members. Over 900 surveys were sent out; 191 responses were received. That number of returns is considered to be statistically relevant by the State Board.

EXECUTIVE BOARD ACTIONS

At the California Executive Board Meeting held January 20, 2018 in Cypress, the following actions were approved:

- Adopted new or revised Policies Procedures from Section G, State Convention: Partial Registration, Registration Refunds, Leonard Leadership Noel Grant. Executive Reimbursement Board. Reimbursement Executive Board Additional Officers, Proposed Budget and Budget Descriptions, Proceedings/Reports, Procedures Manual, Balloting Committee, Executive Board and Standing Committee Chairmen Final Reports, Membership Awards, Perpetual Membership Award, International Excellence in Education. Eleanor Bendell State Scholarship Presentation, and Betty Rosenberg Golden Chapter Award, with an action date of January 19, 2018.
- Approved that California members affected by natural disasters, such as the mudslide, be allowed additional time to pay their dues with no penalty, as determined by the state treasurer.
- Approved that the positions of state corresponding secretary and state recording secretary be combined, and that state annual dues be increased by \$5.00.
- Approved the 2018-2020 Proposed Budget and the 2018-2020 Budget Item Descriptions.
