California Alpha Delta Kappa State Officer Candidate Qualification Information and Application Form

Qualifications: California Alpha Delta Kappa Bylaws, Article VII and Bylaws of the Alpha Delta Kappa Sorority, Incorporated, Article VII, Section 2.a state:

A candidate shall:

- Be an active chapter member
- Be registered and attending the convention at which she is nominated, elected,and installed: an exception to this ruling shall be effected by twothirds vote of the delegate assembly
- Have held an elected chapter office

A candidate for state president or president-elect shall:

- Have served one term as Chapter President
- Have served at least one term on the respective executive board as an elected officer or as president of the chapter presidents' council
- Not hold a chapter office

Procedure:

- Applicant to complete application form and acquire chapter president's signature for endorsement.
- -Submit original application form, a 2"x3" photograph, and two additional copies of the application form postmarked no later than November 30, 2015 to:

Proposed 2016-2018 Budget

A budget committee was formed to review California Alpha Delta Kappa's proposed budget for the 2016 – 2018 biennium. The committee was comprised of Karen Kirby, current California State

Treasurer, Diana Galvan, immediate past California State Treasurer, and four members-at-large: Pam Mallory, Beta Pi, Northern District; Hilary White, Gamma Tau, Marina District; Karen Evans, Lambda, Valley District; Ann Rendon, Iota, Southern District. Following the committee's review, the proposed budget was presented to the California State Executive Board for further review. The 2016 - 2018 California State Budget will be presented to the general membership in the Convention packet sent out in January to chapter presidentst. The budget will be ratified at the State Convention in May, 2016.

While your State Executive Board strives to be fiscally responsible, expenses and operating costs have been rising over the past few years. This may necessitate a transfer from the reserve account. Our services to the membership continue to grow while total revenue is down. THERE ARE TWO WAYS TO INCREASE OUR REVENUE. WE CAN RAISE OUR STATE DUES OR WE CAN RECRUIT NEW MEMBERS!. California State dues, at \$20.00 per member, have not been raised in many bienniums. If our membership continues to decline, a nominal dues increase may be necessary in the future, .

A note to all Chapter Treasurers:

It is **dues collection time** again. Your chapter president should have received the H-138 form that lists all your members and the amount of dues owed. Check with your president first, then contact International Headquarters if your chapter did not receive the form. The deadline is January 1, 2016. Any dues submitted after that date will be considered late and will incur a \$5.00 late fee from both the State and International. Send one check and a copy of the form to me,

Send a separate check and a copy of the form to International. Remember to make a copy for your files. Do not wait for late dues. Send late dues as you receive them.

You may note any member changes on the form. However, your membership chair must file an H-119, Membership Changes form, with International for each member change. That is how member changes are officially made. You can find the form on the International website.

I am thrilled to announce that ALL California chapters have filed their epostcards, and ALL chapters have



submitted their C-1 reports. Thanks to each and every one of you. Together, we got it done. I sent every treasurer an electronic form titled Chapter Financial Spreadsheet . Please print out the form and fill it out on a monthly basis. If you do this, I promise completing the next C-1 report in 2016 will be an easy task. Outgoing treasurers will again complete the report and file the e-postcards before turning the position over to the incoming treasurers because outgoing treasurers understand the financial history of the chapter. Altruism in Action

Virginia Urbina, a Zeta sister, is a kindergarten teacher there. At an Orange Coast Council meeting, she told Karen about their great need for library books. The school is in a high poverty area near the Long Beach Harbor. They loaded up aren's car with 11 banker boxes filled with books, about 500 books. The principal was rather overwhelmed with the amount! Those books were just gathering dust in Karen's garage. Now they will be in the hands of children. And Karen says, "My husband is thrilled to get a corner of the garage back!" **Beta Upsilon** collects children and young adult books (new and slightly used in excellent condition) to donate to women's shelters, the Salvation Army, and food banks. Each year they stamp over 200 books, stating they are from ADK, and donates them at Christmas time. Beta Upsilon also collect toiletries at each meeting and distribute them to those in need. This year they donated 250 toiletries to battered woman's shelters and the Stand Down Homeless Veterans project.

Psi chapter's Lindsay Burningham participated in a 3-Day Walk for the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation. Her chapter supported her with a \$200.00 donation.

Beta Kappa celebrated their 50th Anniversary with a gala celebration. Judy

The celebration was a big success with past sisters attending and

Zeta members attended the Precious Lamb 9th Annual Banquet at the Hotel Maya in Long Beach. Precious Lamb is a faith based preschool for homeless

children and one of altruistic causes supports. They high ratio of

and do an impressive job of supporting the needs of children and their families far beyond academics.

ADK - Zeta members Roberta Patterson and Kathy Charvet teach art at Millikan High School and have involved several other Millikan art teachers in an Art Gala each spring for Precious Lamb. Art students spend several months preparing portraits of the preschool students in several different mediums including handmade pillow portraits. Those portraits are then auctioned at the Art Gala. All together the evening raised over \$18,000 for Precious Lamb. Millikan art students also make quilts for naptime at school. It's rewarding to have such direct ties to the preschool beyond writing a check or visiting the classroom.

Beta Kappa's grant winners presented their reports on how they have used their ADK grant money:

Selena Chavez at NJHS used her \$300 grant award to purchase mosaic tiles and supplies for her visual arts students to create mosaic murals after school which will be put in the office and lunchroom and are portable so can be moved around the campus. Her 25 students planned and drew out their mosaic creation.

Mark Drumm from the NJHS Rocketry Club used his grant money to buy motors for the rockets his teams would use in each rocket they built hoping to go to the national competition Team America Rocket Rechallenge. The four teams designed their rockets on a CAD system computer and many students from the school watch the lunchtime launches. His class has both boys and girls and lots of parent involvement.

Jacob Goldsmith from NMHS used his grant money to purchase a Chromebook to use for his calculus class and computer science club. His students produced Youtube videos to show how to solve calculus problems and were able to check out the Chromebook to take home also.

Alisa Jensen from Whiteford Preschool used her grant money to purchase materials for her sensory bin. All items can be washed and are used with autistic students who are terrified of touching things to develop their tactile comfort and awareness. She has 6-15 students a one aide and was so thankful for this addition to her classroom which may seem simple but is an amazing tool to help her students.

We are all so inspired and amazed to see what these incredible teachers are doing in their classrooms!

Our ongoing support of The Friendly Center with providing school supplies, birthday bags, Thanksgiving Meal for a Family and Adopting a Family for Christmas has truly made a difference in our communities.

On December 7, several Sisters will again go to work at Samaritan's Purse to help provide Christmas gifts for needy children. We also support St. Jude's Medical Center with monthly donations.

However, we had an opportunity to become educated while donating to Guide Dogs for the Blind. Neighbors of Harriet Kelly were our guest speakers and provided a magnificent program. Lance and Mindy Wulff, Mindy's Guide Dog for the Blind Braxton, and their Therapy Dog, Sammy shared truly valuable information and were our guests for lunch afterwards.

Lance takes their Therapy Dog, Sammy to locations where he can be loved and show love by being petted and talked to. Some examples include Skilled Nursing Facilities and Convalescent Homes. Mindy suddenly lost her vision when she was 42 years old. After a few serious accidents while trying to manage with just a cane, Mindy agreed to have a Guide Dog for the Blind. The puppies that qualify for this program go through a great deal of training with an Foster Family. They then go through intensive training with the person who is lucky enough to get them.

Mindy continues to teach at a Middle School as a Special Education Teacher working with children that have Aspergers. Braxton sits under her desk while she is teaching and Mindy uses Adaptive Technology to work with her students. Her students know the rules about not petting Braxton while he is working; but the school staff has to be reminded.

Mindy and Lance with their dogs, Braxton and Sammy were a wonderful inspiration. It made us all feel thankful and blessed for what we have. It also helped us truly understand what we can do to be respectful while being helpful of individuals with visual impairments.
