The 2016 California State Convention will be in the HEART of California at the Wyndham Visalia on April 29th through May 1st, 2016. Call 559 651-5000 for room reservations. The registration fee is just \$110.00! You can register on line and pay with Paypal (a \$3.00 fee will apply). A registration form is included in this newsletter and can be printed out, completed and sent to the Convention Registration Chairman with your check. REGISTRATION PACKETS WILL BE ONLINE AND NOT MAILED OUT TO CHAPTER PRESIDENTS. On the website, go to the list of links on the right hand side and click on "State Convention". There, you will find a link to the online registration form, the proposed budget, the proposed altruistic projects, the proposed resolution, and much more! REMEMBER, THE WEBSITE IS www.adkcalif.org, AND THE USER NAME AND PASSWORD ARE BOTH kore123.

#### WHO CAN BE A DELEGATE?

Each chapter gets 1 voting delegate for every 10 members (a minimum of 1 delegate per chapter). If your chapter is planning on initiating new members, the paperwork must be submitted to International by March 1st! Chapters should send an alternate as well!

Council Presidents serve as a voting delegate at the convention. If the Council President is unable to attend, then the Council Secretary may serve as her alternate.

Each State Committee Chairman and Convention Committee Chairman is a voting delegate.

Voting delegates also include each Past State President as well as State Executive Board members.

There is one delegate for every ten sustaining members (or major fraction thereof) attending the convention.

Convention Encourage your first timers to register for the State Convention! Each Council gets a \$100 grant for every four chapters to be awarded to a first timer




### **historians!**

#### \* LIVING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

— The Living Memorial Scholarship is an annual scholarship in the amount of \$2,500. The Living Memorial Scholarship program provides an Alpha Delta Kappa member the opportunity for professional growth through traveling away from her home environment and/or studying another culture to promote World Understanding and to expand her

knowledge and develop materials to be used in the classroom. Requests for applications should be made in writing to the Living Memorial Scholarship Chairman Sara Ann Birdsong at 6642 Crawford Pl Rd Appling, GA 30802, or by accessing the password-protected portion of the Alpha Delta Kappa website. The completed application must be mailed to International Headquarters and postmarked by February 15.

## \* FINE ARTS GRANTS (For current Alpha Delta Kappa members) —


The Fine Arts Grant(s) will be used to promote study and awareness of the Arts for students. The grants are available to Alpha Delta Kappa members in good standing, both actively teaching and retired. A fund of \$10,000 has been established to be awarded as a single grant or to be divided among two or more applicants. Applications are available on the International website and must be returned to International Headquarters via "Certified Mail," and received by February 15.

### \* Maxine B. Pettibone Scholarship:

The Maxine B. Pettibone Scholarship is awarded to the direct descendants of active members of Alpha Delta Kappa. This scholarship was created for students working on their Master's degree in education who have the aspiration of continuing as outstanding educators in the field of education. The fall semester scholarship application must be postmarked or received on or before March 1 and the spring semester scholarship must be postmarked or received on or before September 1.

\* REGIONAL MINI-SCHOLARSHIPS:

(For Alpha Delta Kappa members in good standing only) — Under the umbrella of the Regional Professional Development Scholarships, International annually gives each region \$3,000 to distribute to members in good standing, whether actively engaged in teaching or not, who apply to attend non  $A\Delta K$ sponsored conferences, conventions, seminars, workshops and non-credit classes. The maximum scholarship is \$500. Applications are on the International website. For activities taking place between November 15 and May 15, applications must be postmarked no later than October 15. Applications for activities taking place between May 15 and November 15 must be postmarked no later than April 15.

After lunch, Ken then led an informative tour of downtown Bakersfield.








