

October brought Founders' Day and a myriad of ways to recognize the four women who started Alpha Delta Kappa




Alpha Delta (Ann Leonard)



Last year, the California Cares team of California Alpha Delta Kappa chapters raised \$10,797 for The Longest Day fight against Alzheimer's. The Alzheimer's Association is one of International's altruistic projects. The California Cares Team is part of A∆K International's 2021 Global Team.

The Longest Day this year is June 20, 2021. It is time to register your chapter as part of our California Cares team so your chapter sisters, family and friends will have a place to go to donate, and your chapter will get the credit. Even though June 21 seems a long way away, all chapters should be on the team now.

Here is how to register your chapter:

- 1. Go to alz.org/adk. This will take you to the Alpha Delta Kappa page.
- 2. Click on Join a Team. When asked if you have participated before choose "No" so you can register your chapter correctly (even if you have participated in the past).
- 3. Type "California Cares" in the first Search box. Scroll down and click on "Join".
- 4. Set a fundraising goal (you can change it later), and decide if you want a T-shirt. If not, you can check "No Donation".
- 5. Fill in the form. Then register your chapter's name by typing **CA + your chapter's name** in the <u>First Name</u> box. Put your last name in the <u>Last Name</u> box. Fill in the rest of the form. Hint: In Additional Information, you can choose Fundraise Only.
- 6. Check the box "Agree to Terms and Conditions", review your details, and finish registration.

While you are on the website, click on Fundraising Ideas at the top of the page. Click on Physical Distancing, then scroll down to see the categories of suggested virtual fundraising activities.
