

President's Message



I am excited and overjoyed – now that I have begun my journey as State President. We

have already begun to "Step into the Future" with an action plan for the biennium.

Things began quickly with the NW/SW Regional Conference in Hawai'i, which was very informative and provided a great deal of ideas for moving forward.

The Executive Board's Leadership Training in August gave us the opportunity to implement the major focuses that I identified in my acceptance speech, specifically, Tech and Support for Chapters. The first action item was introduced to the Executive Board by Vice President for Membership - called Leadership by Committee – Alternative Model for Alpha Delta Kappa Leadership. The Board is in the process of developing criteria for determining chapter(s) eligibilty.

There will be two main chapter leaders: Communication Contact and Treasurer

*No need for full slate of chapter officers - *Less* responsibility for filling out number of forms.

•The *focus* will be on the important work of $A\Delta K$:

*Excellence in Education – supporting practicing teachers; scholarships and grants

*Altruism – Choosing charities to support every year

*World Understanding – at least one program addressing this topic during a biennium

Second, in response to the Feasibility Study Resolution that passed at the 2020 state convention, the Board will adopt the **Pilot Program (Enhanced Open Board meeting)** that will allow members not on the Board to attend an Executive Board Meeting.

NOTE: The Board meeting is open to all. Under this Program, this will allow members to be able to bring to the Board matters that concern their chapter for the first hour of the Board Meeting.

The Pilot Program will start with the Northern Conference, October 1st. The program will be available at each District Conference throughout the biennium. Information about the procedure will be given on the flyer at each conference.

Third, **Greek Squad** is in the process to create "tech support" to assist members in the use of technology in filling out forms, navigating websites and other technology needs members face within the realm of Alpha Delta Kappa, We have stepped into the future! Let us see how far we can go!

President Rosena's Goals 2022-2024

Goal 1 – Increase the number of chapters who reach the goal of having 7 pearls by the end of this biennium, by 2 over the past biennium.

We have already made the state webpage more user friendly. We will specifically assist chapters with reaching the goal of 7 pearls by uploading the pearl requirements to the state webpage and providing links (where possible) to the necessary forms to complete each step. We will reach out to chapters as deadlines approach to remind them of actions they can take to earn pearls and to offer our assistance.

Goal 2 – Establish a communication/technology group to give members support on the use of technology.

Form a "Greek Squad" at the Executive Board level. This group will assist chapters by providing one-onone support for technology issues, assisting them in navigating the International and California AΔK websites and in completing reports.

Goal 3 – Open lines of communication with the chapters to ensure that any chapters struggling to remain active are encouraged to notify the Board in time for intervention.

At all Council meetings, liaisons to the Councils will include in presentations a message that the Board would like to hear of any issues in the chapters. Any issues raised at the time of the meeting or afterward will be included in the Liaison summary and reported to the State President immediately.

Goal 4 – Increase the use of available scholarships for chapter members.

Many of the available scholarships have gone unused. The Board will clearly notify the chapters of the deadlines and requirements for these scholarships in sufficient time for the chapters to nominate sisters. ***********

Once again, California Alpha Delta Kappa sisters joined forces in our

fundraising efforts for The Longest Day. Together, we raised \$10,427 and exceeded California Cares team goal of \$10,000. California Cares ranked fifth in all the Alpha Delta Kappa Global Teams. The Alpha Delta Kappa Global Team, with teams from all states, nations, and provinces, collectively raised \$196,119.96.

Here are some fundraising highlights:

- Doreen Barns, *Beta Rho*, raised \$2,435 which put her in the top ten of all the Global Teams.
- California Gamma Mu raised \$1,772 which made that chapter number one of all the California Cares teams.
- California *Beta Eta* raised \$945.
- California *Beta Rho* raised an additional \$600 beyond what Doreen Barns raised.
- California *Zeta* raised \$545.
- California *Beta Omicron* raised \$460.
- California *Gamma* raised \$450
- \$1,860 was donated directly to the California Cares team.

Thanks go to all who participated this year and helped make our fundraising a success. I have agreed to continue as the California Cares team captain for 2023. You will be hearing from me in November. Meantime, please discuss your fundraising ideas with your chapter. It all begins again in January 2023.

- Read the MDM. You can find the answers to most questions in that document.
- Contact your chapter's former CMC. They may have a thumb

drive with important information to give to you. If not, they should have a file. Be aware that there are changes since the last biennium, especially the Chapter Needs Assessment (CNA), so some of the information may not be current.

Look for my emailed Membership Message every month or so for current membership happenings. Chapter Presidents will also receive these emails. Contact me if I am sending them to someone in error and let me know who should be receiving them instead.

Remember that <u>the Chapter</u> <u>Needs Assessment needs to be filled</u> <u>out on the AΔK website and is due</u> <u>by October 15 at the latest</u>. I am setting up CNA training sessions in September to answer questions and support you with this task. You should receive the Zoom information plus instructions about how to fill out the CNA next week.

Thousands of dollars of Alpha Delta Kappa grant money goes unspent in our organization because members do not apply. To help generate more applications, the following list contains ideas that were accepted at the International level.

1. Hands-on student science kits

2. Library books featuring stories of diversity

3. Phonic and morpheme flash cards (i.e. Morpheme Magic)

4. Hands-on math materials (i.e. individual wipe-off boards, base ten blocks, place value charts)

5. Aids for mainstreamed visuallyimpaired students, Braille learning aids for sighted classmates

6. Virtual robotics and *Class Connect* subscriptions

7. Aids to teach social and emotional learning (i.e. *Ninja Life Hacks*)

8. Kindergarten phonic aids

<u>Club Tome</u> (a book club for grades
3-5) and a Tome Society in the school

10. Hands-on individual geography kits

11. Materials to set up a classroom business

Caitlyn Peterson's 4th grade "SUPER class" at Sunny Sands Elementary in Cathedral City is a delight. A superhero aficionado, she has been collecting and creating comic book memorabilia for her classroom for over 10 years.

Her lectern and desk are covered with Wonder Woman upholstery. Her custom-made curtains look like comic books. Her hand-made lamp has a Batman shade. Spider-Man spins a balloon-string web over the door.

Lady Venom, a fluffy bunny rabbit that is 0% venomous and

100% cute, hops around the room as an unofficial therapy animal for angsty pre-teens. Guinea pigs Chilly and Tootsie live near her library and reading corner, and there is a terrarium full of Madagascar hissing cockroaches. (She actually ordered two male cockroaches but mistakenly received one male and one female, hence the tankful.)

She teaches "wondrous writers" in homage to Wonder Woman and "marvelous math" in honor of her favorite Marvel characters.

"There are a lot of hands-on activities," Peterson said. "My kids move, and they talk with each other: it's controlled chaos."

Like her classroom design, her teaching style is not at all conventional — and parents have been skeptical — but it works so well that Peterson was a 2019-20 Teacher of the Year at Julius Corsini Elementary in Desert Hot Springs.

"We're loud, but we're learning, enjoying, and having fun," Peterson said. Her motto is: Do your adventures and get your business done.
