June 21, 2023 is the Longest Day, a day with the most light and a day we fight against Alzheimer's disease. Alpha Delta Kappa will kick off the Global




IMPORTANCE OF RECORDING CHAPTER HISTORY - Recreating a Lost Banner

The application criteria cover the chapter's ongoing program activities, community altruistic efforts, contribution to scholarship programs, and participation at all levels of Alpha Delta Kappa. Since the application spans a biennium, keeping a "running record" using the application form makes it easier to document your chapter. Using the rubric, the State President reviews and scores all applications. The highest scoring applicant will be honored at the State Convention. The State President will acknowledge the receipt of applications.

Betty Rosenberg Golden Chapter Award

The Golden Chapter Award was first given at the 1996 State Convention to honor Elizabeth "Betty" Rosenberg, Past International President, and Past California State President (1954-1956). In 1953, Betty was a founding sister in Alpha Chapter in Oakland, California's first chapter. Betty loved Alpha Delta Kappa and will be an ever-present inspiration and role model for her California sisters. The

"Our founders; Agnes, Marion, Hattie and Marie chose pearls. In ancient times the pearl was a most treasured and valuable gem and a symbol of unblemished perfection. It has long been known as The Queen of Gems. Natural pearls are so rare and expensive that they were reserved almost exclusively for the nobility and the very rich. The Latin word for pearl literally means **unique**- attesting to the fact that no two pearls are identical. Is this what the founders were trying to tell

us? We- the members of our organization are **unique**, with not one of us being identical. I kind of like that idea of why the pearl is used on our badge and for achievements."

Being unique is what makes each Alpha Delta Kappa sister so extraordinary.
