- Vice President for Membership computer skills are expected
- Serves as State Membership Chairman
- Oversees collection of Chapter Needs Assessment forms
- Treasurer computer skills highly recommended
- Administers the operation accounts of the State using Quicken software
- Oversees the State Budget
- Collects dues, fees, and assessments
- Disburses funds as directed by the President/Executive Board

Once again, California Alpha Delta Kappa's sisters joined forces in our fundraising efforts for The Longest Day. THE LONGEST DAY Together, California Cares Team raised \$9,766. California Cares ranked seventh out of the 110 Alpha Delta Kappa Global Teams. California Gamma Mu raised \$4,149 and

ranked eighth out of 363 Global Team participants. The Alpha Delta Kappa Global Team, with teams from all states, nations, and provinces, collectively raised \$273,544.78, far surpassing the goal of raising \$250,000.


