#### LEONARD GRANTS FOR MEETING ATTENDANCE

**Noel Leonard**, CA state president 1992-1994, left a legacy to CA Alpha Delta Kappa making it possible to award \$100 grants to first time attendees at the CA state convention. One grant is available to each council. Each chapter may nominate one member who has not attended a CA state convention and who shows promise of leadership in the organization. The council president shall conduct a random drawing to determine the recipient of the Noel Leonard Grant for first-time attendees to the CA state convention. The council presidents will notify the state president of their selections by March 1, 2024. In a second part of her legacy, Noel left funds for \$100 grants to council officers or a council designee to attend regional conferences to further their leadership skills. One grant is available to each council. The council president must notify the state president no later than June 1, 2024.
